Object Lesson: What matters most?

- Show the three pictures: an amusement park, a Nintendo Wii, and a group of loving friends
- Ask the kids, which matters most to them? Then ask them, which do you think matters most to God?

MC Transition: That's right! God wants us to LOVE others. This matters most to him! He asks us to love others and to love God with all our heart, soul, mind and strength. In fact, it is the most important thing we could ever do! **That's why our Word of the Day is, Love Matters Most.**

Word of the Day: Love matters most.

Definition: Matters most – the most important thing in life

This week's Bible Verse: *I may speak in different languages of men or even angels. But if I don't have love, then I am only a noisy bell or a ringing cymbal.* 1 Corinthians 13:1 (ICB)

Bible Lesson: The Great Commandment – Matthew 22:35–40 (ICB)

Jesus' ministry or work lasted only 3½ years. During this time He was popular with His followers, but many who didn't follow Jesus doubted Him and were against His teachings. Two groups of people who doubted Jesus' teachings were the Pharisees and the Sadducees. The Pharisees were big rule-followers. The problem was that they followed the religious rules and laws so closely that they forgot the *most* important law, the law about love. They didn't always care about others; only about making sure everyone followed the rules. For the Pharisees, it was all about how they looked on the outside and not the inside. This bothered Jesus. He thought they were hypocrites. A hypocrite is someone who says one thing and does something different. There were also these guys called the Sadducees. They were priests who only believed in written law and didn't believe that Jesus was the Son of God.

One particular Pharisee was an expert at the Law. (The Law is taught in the first five books of the Bible: Genesis, Exodus, Leviticus, Numbers and Deuteronomy.) This Pharisee asked Jesus a question. He wanted to know which commandment from the Law was the greatest and most important. Jesus answered him by saying, "Love the Lord your God with all your heart, soul and mind. This is the greatest and most important command. The second command is like the first: love your neighbor as you love yourself. All of the other Laws written by prophets depend on these two commands." After listening to Jesus that day, these religious leaders didn't dare ask Him another question. They were astonished by His wisdom and knowledge.

Big Idea: Love matters most. The religious Pharisee knew all of the laws, but had forgotten how to show love to others. He wanted to trick Jesus to see if He would say anything against the Law. Jesus knew the man was trying to trick Him. Jesus challenged him with the greatest commandment, which was to do two things: to love God and to love others. Jesus knew the religious leader was an expert at rules, but Jesus wanted him to be an expert at loving others! Jesus is the ultimate example of a BFF because He always did everything in the most loving way.

Application: How can we love like Jesus? It is not easy to do. Love is a feeling *and* an action. The key to being a BFF is not just telling someone you love them but *showing* them as well. Remember Jesus said we need to love others just as much as we love ourselves. How can we show love to others? That is a challenge that we get to live out daily! Being loving is more important than being popular, famous, smart or the best athlete. God wants you to love Him with all of your heart, soul and mind, and to love others. A BFF knows that love matters most.

Show It

Live It

Read the following key Live It questions aloud and see if any of the children know the answer. If they are stumped on an answer, encourage the leaders to help the kids out.

- 1) What was the Religious Leader an expert at?
- 2) What are the two greatest commandments?
- 3) How can I love others?

Live it Out Challenge: Jesus says that LOVE MATTERS MOST! He says it is the greatest commandment. This week think about how you can love God and others better. Write down how you showed God that you loved him and how you showed others that you loved them. How did it feel to show others that LOVE MATTERS MOST? Bring it back to church next week and share it with a leader.

Store It

Materials Needed: Various verses written out on pieces of paper, including one with today's verse.

Preparation: Hide the verses around the room before the children enter.

Instructions: Tell the kids that they must find today's memory verse somewhere in the room. The team that finds the correct verse first wins points!

Play It

Game: Who is Your BFF? (best friend forever)

Overview: Children will make play dough figures of what their BFF looks like.

Materials Needed: Several jars of play dough

Instructions:

- Have a leader pick 10 children from each team. (There can be more leaders with kids than number of teams.)
- They will then form a line behind that leader and take turns making a play dough BFF.
- Each child will have 30 seconds to work with the play dough.
- After the first child goes, each child will then build onto it.
- The team that makes the best BFF according to the MC, leaders and other kids wins!

MC Transition: That was a fun way to create BFF's out of play dough. Now remember, God is our BFF. If you ever feel alone or in need of a friend, God is there and He will always love you to be your BFF!

Leader Share Time & Winners

Bring up an adult or student leader to share a little testimony on how this week's lesson affected their life recently. (This should be 30 seconds to a minute.)
